How we want to reach it:






The Energy Union The 2016 PINC

- Provides transparent and forward-looking information on pan-European investment needs
- Helps understanding of the full nuclear lifecycle in the context of post Fukushima safety requirements
- Contributes to Member States decisions on energy mix




Projection of nuclear capacity PINC 2016






2016 Reference Scenario *Gross Electricity generation by fuel type*






2016 Reference Scenario Projection of key policy indicators
